

ADEYFIELD HERITAGE WALK

- THE ROUTE -

starting from The Queen's Square (1). *

- * The numbers in brackets relate to the notes in a publication (price ^{20p}15p) available from the Council of Voluntary Service Bookshop, which gives informative details about these points of scenic and historical interest on the route of the 1½ to 2 hours walk.
- : From the Square exit by the side of the New Venture (2) and the Community Centre (3) and Youth Club (4) into Reith Fields (5) and across the diagonal path into Longlands (6)
 - : Go left to the end of the Fields, and turn down the signposted, lamplit path (7) which runs by the side of Adeyfield School grounds (8) into Tenzing Road (9) by Greenhills Primary School (10) and so to the Crabtree pub by Leverstock Green Road (11)
 - : Crossing over, continue along the footpath through the fenced stretch (12) to go over New Park Drive and Masons Road (13) and through the belt of trees which screen the housing from the industrial area (14), to come out there in Maylands Avenue (15)
 - : Walk to the right as far as the Schroff factory (16) and down the pedestrian and cycle path by the side of the Regional Post Office Supplies Depot (17) to come out into The Flags, then to cross over New Park Drive and go along the pedestrian/cycle dual track to come into Leverstock Green Road by the one-time Coxpond Farmhouse and Pond (18)
 - : Cross over to Vauxhall Road, and go along this past Ranelagh Road, opposite which is the clubhouse and ground of Hemel Hempstead Town Football Club (19). Turn left into Farland Road, which runs round Evelyn Sharp House (20) into Field Road and so, to the left, into Longlands, opposite to Homefield Road (21)
 - : Crossing over, walk left to the corner, opposite which is the Roman Catholic Church (22) and turn right to go along the paved path which runs in front of the flats (23) going along the remnant of the old St. Albans Road, to follow the path which leads round the grounds of the tall flats and Bennetts End House (24) into White Hart Road
 - : Cross over into and walk along White Hart Drive (25) from where - through the gaps can be glimpsed attractive views of Jarman Fields and the Bennetts End Neighbourhood (26)
 - : Opposite the tree-lined pathway on the right (7) go along the path by the hedge to the pedestrian bridge over St. Albans Road, which is an excellent vantage point from which to get a sight of the first of several panoramic views which the walk provides (27)
 - : From the bridge, go along the path into Lower Yott, and turn left into and down the sloping Turners Hill up to the wooded area on the left a little way past the telephone box on the right. Here go down the hard path and through the gap on the right into the open field, for a panoramic view of the north end of the town and its background
 - : Return to, and continue along Turners Hill as far as the open field opposite to Wood Farm Road (28), going along the signposted footpath past the town's first adventure playground (29) with a view to the left, through the wide gap, of the Paradise area (30)
 - : Where this path runs into Hillfield Road (31) take the diagonal path to the right, from which there is yet another panoramic view of the town (32). This leads into Seymour Crescent which runs into Mountfield Road, and so into Adeyfield Road (33)
 - : Go to the right, passing the old people's bungalows (34), up to Broadfield Road (35) There cross over and continue as far as, and turn down Springfield Road on the left (36)
